We want to make you aware that the concert and fireworks will be at the high school this year due to the construction at the middle school. Also, the parade route has been extended this year- it will now start near 600 South by the city yards. To better serve our citizens and quests we have also added new park picnic tables that will be implemented into our celebration. We are excited to have the COVID restrictions lifted and be able to get back to normal with our festivities.

As you know, we are in a severe drought. We have implemented new policies to make our water last as long as possible. We ask that you continue to abide with the ordinances by not watering between the hours of 10am-6pm, not watering in one place for more than one hour at a time and not watering cement or nonvegetated areas. A good suggestion is to raise YOUR LAWNMOWER BLADE so your lawn will need less water. We all need to do our part to ensure water is available when we really need it. We appreciate your efforts this far! Your cooperation has made an impact. The city has NOT implemented any ban on personal fireworks. We do ask that with the dry conditions-that you use extreme caution in doing so and abide with the state laws in doing them between the hours of 11am-11pm, July 22-25. Also, have a water source nearby wherever you might be.

Adding to this busy time, Monroe city will be hosting the Cal Ripken Pacific Southwest Regional Regional 8U baseball tournament July 18-23rd. We will have teams here from California, Nevada, Arizona, and Utah the week of July 18. There are some exciting events planned throughout the week along with fun and competitive baseball!
