Our plan is to keep irrigation water on until October 15, weather permitting, and if the pond has water. Please be prepared for intermittent water shut off's or an immediate permanent shut off. We just can not out guess what the water situation will be.

Councilmember Cartwright has been working very hard at raising money for the monument and we are hoping to start construction on it soon. Please be mindful of the school crossing zones on Main Street and 100 S, and the drop off areas at each of our schools.


